The airport and its volunteer groups will receive signs indicating their participation in the program. The signs should be placed in a prominent location on the airport, such as the airport entrance road. The sings serve to promote the program to the public and give recognition to the volunteer groups.

- Interested airports should contact MnDOT Office of Aeronautics to request an application form and program guidelines.
- Interested groups and individuals should contact their local airport for information about participating in the program.
